

#### Starting a Jewish Library

Let books be your dining table, And you shall be full of delights Let them be your mattress And you shall sleep restful nights. ~Author Unknown



In 1925, Fanny Goldstein, a librarian at the West End Branch of the Boston Public Library, set up an exhibit of Judaic books and used it as a focus of what she called Jewish Book Week. In 1927, the event was adopted by communities around the country. During its first fifteen years, the annual date of the program coincided with the holiday of Lag B'Omer or Shavuot, regarded as a scholars' festivals. In 1940, the event was moved to pre-Hanukkah, so as to promote books of Jewish content as Hanukkah gifts. This timetable remains in place to this day. Jewish Book Week became so popular and so filled with activities that it was extended to a one-month period in 1943. Isn't it wonderful to find a comfy spot and curl up with a new book or an old favorite?

We are encouraging all of our families to start a Jewish library. Please make sure you have enrolled your child in the different reading programs through Federation: PJ Library and Sifriyat Pijama B'America (Hebrew). For our somewhat older children, there is PJ Our Way (ages 9 – 11). Also check out PJ Library Radio – a Jewish music radio station.


