As we welcome Amit, we thought it would be a good idea to get to know him a little bit in advance, so we did a little Question and Answer session with him. Guess what? HE DOESN'T LIKE CHOCOLATE! Read on to learn more.

-- Tell us about your family. I come from a small and warm family. My father, Alexander, is

54. He is a practical engineer and a real handyman. He made aliya with his family from Azerbaijan when he was 9 years old. My father always stands by my side, giving me tips and advice when needed. From him I've learned kindness and

respect. He is the best man I know.



My mother, Sarit, is 47. She is a teacher at the main high school in Sderot (my home town). Her specialty is math but she is also the vice-principal of the high school. She is the smartest person I know. She is really into books and cooking. My mother is my best friend and I can share everything with her.

I am the oldest of three siblings. My sister, Rehut, is 21. At the age of 18, she volunteered for a year (before her army duty) with kids at risk in south Tel-Aviv. She served in the army as an army tech guide to reservist troops. After her service, she went to be a guide in a Jewish summer camp in Chicago via the Jewish agency program.

My youngest

brother, Yehonatan, is 16. He wants to be a doctor when he grows up. In Israel, we have a special program for military doctors and he will start this program next year. My family is my anchor. They are really important to me and I have there full support for my Shlichut.

--What is your favorite thing to do in Israel? I enjoy traveling around Israel and the beach is my favorite place to go. I think the best beaches in Israel are the Tel-Aviv beach



and Eilat beach. In Eilat, in southeastern Israel, you can find coral reefs and wild animals (including dolphins), and snorkeling

is must-do! surrounding nothing but desert, and on the Red Sea shore. Eilat is the perfect place to read a book, meet new people, and enjoy late-night campfires.

- **--Do you have any hobbies?** My hobbies are hiking, reading, watching sports, and hanging out with my friends. Although I like to host people, I adore outdoor activities.
- --What are you looking forward to in Chattanooga? Experiencing other cultures and meeting new people! As a nature lover, I look forward to exploring the wild side of Tennessee, and to travel.

--Do you have a favorite and least favorite food we should know about? I love all kinds of food! I love BBQ (making and eating), cheese, and salty things. I'm not into sweets at all. I don't like chocolate! In the kitchen, I'm very good at making *lacinia* and *shakshuka* (spicy!).






