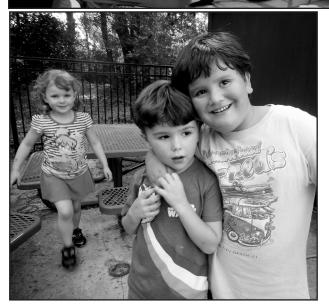

A Little More About Me

Hey Y'all!

I've completed a month in

this amazing city! I have met lots of people and I look forward to meeting many more of you very soon. Already the experience exceeds any expectations I had. The view is stunning, the people are lovely, and the community is so special! I have a lot more to learn, but community members have already helped me a lot! Thank you for that.

Let me tell you a little more about myself. I come from a small town in southern Israel called Sderot. Sderot is a city that started as a transit camp (housing for new immigrants in the 1950s) and has evolved over the years into a city in itself. Today, fewer than 30,000 residents live in the city, most of them from the communities of Morocco and the Soviet Union, which together form a small, warm community.

Sderot is recognized as a musical city that has spawned a number of artists and bands that have become a significant part of Israeli music culture. In recent years, the city has been growing and growing, mainly thanks to "Sapir College" --a small college specializing in the arts --which attracts active students from all over Israel who have established diverse businesses over the years. During the spring, the city also attracts tourists from all over Israel thanks to the "anemones" blossom: a unique red flower that colors the hills bright red. In addition, the city holds various festivals throughout the year, one of which is the Film Festival - Southern Cinema.

Unfortunately, the city also has a less glamorous reputation as the closest city to the Gaza Strip, and includes kibbutzim and other *moshavim* in the area as the "Gaza envelope" area. The city has been under rocket threat from Hamas for twenty years. During these years, the residents lived through a large number of military operations and sat through long hours in shelters, knowing their lives could change from moment to moment. Due to the security situation, the city is considered to be the "most protected city in the world." Schools, businesses, bus stations and homes are all equipped with sheltered space. I will tell you about the unorthodox reality and life in Sderot more extensively at my program on October 24th.



At 18, I joined the IDF Navy and served on a battleship as a mechanic for three years. It was a particularly challenging service where I came to know the sea and the machine. Upon release from the army, I moved to the city of Eilat - the southernmost city in Israel that lies on the Red Sea coast and borders Jordan and Egypt. In Eilat I worked in the hotel industry as a bartender at what was considered one of the best cocktail bars in Israel.

Eilat is a special city that combines desert and sea and which hosts a variety of activities such as field trips, jeep tours, scuba diving, or just sitting on the beach and enjoying the indulgent heat of the desert. I lived in Eilat for two years.

After my time in Eilat, I returned home to Sderot, continued to work as a bartender, and at the same time completed my studies for the university. In September 2018, I started studying at Ben Gurion University in Beer-Sheva. After the first semester, I realized that engineering studies were not for me and went looking for work that combines more education and community activities. This is how I found myself at the Jewish Agency that sent me to this charming city of Chattanooga!

I love to travel, and have visited quite a few countries: Greece, Spain, Germany, Hungary, Thailand, Cambodia, Vietnam, India, and more recently, Egypt and Montenegro. Of course, in Israel too, I have traveled quite a bit, and I am proud to say that I know my country mainly through my feet. Feel free to ask me about my trips and share your experiences with me!

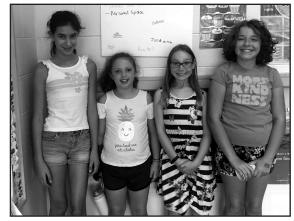

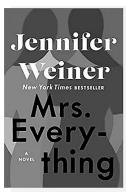

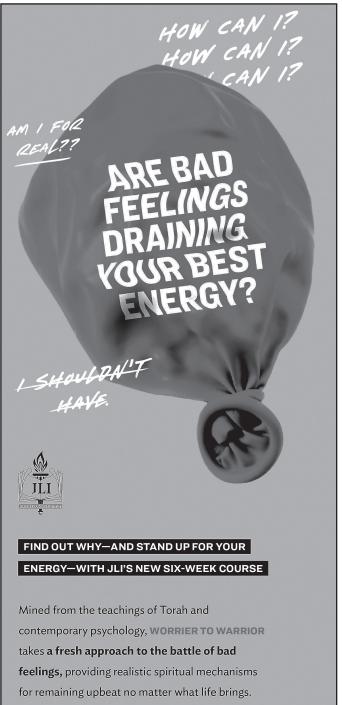
We also were introduced to JewQ and are so proud to represent Chattanooga in this international competition. I can already tell that this is going to be a good and a sweet new year!
